

City of Cortland faces growing problem of teenage substance abuse

Assembly member C.D. Rappleyea said, "We plan to discuss effective methods of protecting young people from the dangers of drug and alcohol abuse." Rappleyea is encouraging Cortland county citizens concerned with the growing problem of teenage substance abuse to attend a public hearing on Thurs., Sept. 28 from 7 to 9 p.m. at Cortland Junior-Senior High School.

The event, hosted by Rappleyea, is part of an Assembly Republican statewide effort to learn more about teenage drug and alcohol abuse.

"Parents, school officials, health professionals, community leaders and interested citizens are invited to join us at Cortland Junior-Senior High School to participate in a roundtable discussion,"

Members of the Assembly Republican Conference who will attend the public meeting include Rappleyea, Assemblywoman Patricia McGee and Assemblymen Thomas Barraga, Harold Brown and Ralph Eannace.

"Community involvement is very important to our efforts to combat this problem," Rappleyea said. "I hope all citizens who are concerned about drug and alcohol abuse among young people will join us at Cortland Junior-Senior High School on Thurs., Sept. 28 at 7 p.m."
