When the Supreme Court ruled last June 21 in *Texas v. Johnson* that flag-burning is a protected form of expression under the First Amendment? Does the definition of 'flag' include non-traditional emblems, such as clothing, paper, paintings, or a cake? What about replicas of the flag that are not precise copies of the current 50-star flag? What about older flags, like the 13-star flag? And if, as the Supreme Court says, flag-burning is a form of protected speech, is it really unpatriotic to defend this form of expression?"

The cake-cutting ceremony will take place in the quad between the Old Main and Miller buildings at noon on Oct. 20. In case of rain, the ceremony will be held in the lobby of Old Main.
