Cast announced for "She Stoops to Conquer; or, The Mistakes of a Night"

The Theatre Department of SUNY Cortland is pleased to announce the cast of its upcoming production, "She Stoops To Conquer; or, The Mistakes of a Night." This lively romp through the English countryside of the Eighteenth Century was written by Oliver Goldsmith. The story is of Young Marlow and Kate Hardcastle, whose parents intend them to marry without having met! Marlow—accompanied by his friend Hastings—are led to believe the Hardcastle's home is an inn by the devilish Tony Lumpkin. Marlow unknowingly treats Mr. Hardcastle as the landlord. Kate, who Marlow

assumes is a maid, takes advantage of the misunderstanding to shatter Marlow's reserved nature. Amidst all this confusion, Hasting and his bride-to-be Constance Neville plan to elope to France. An assortment of odd characters and inept servants only add to the merriment, and at play's end, the mistakes of a night are happily resolved.

More than a dozen students and faculty members will contribute time and talents to this highly entertaining production. Scott Koenig and Sara Corica play the foolish Mr. and Mrs. Hardcastle. Kristin Gates, most recently seen as Bianca in "Taming

of the Shrew," will play their daughter Kate Hardcastle. Constance Neville, Kate's devoted cousin, is portrayed by Nicole Thomson. Tony Lumpkin is performed by Joseph Summa, seen in last season's "The Importance of Being Earnest." Ted Mancini will play Young Marlow, the oft times wordless lover. Faculty members Michael Staczar and Joseph McFate lend their support as George Hastings and Sir Charles Marlow. Lee Barrett, Sue Gaertner, Ivy Phillips, Chris Turner, and Andrew Whelan complete the cast of zany characters.

The Age of Rock

"Shake, Rattle & Roll," "Good Rockin' Tonight," "Rock Around the Clock;" these were the momentous beginnings. The Beatles, the Rolling Stones, Bruce Springsteen; they were some of the developments. All of that is part of the intriguing and fascinating history of rock music, which will be documented with a superbly orchestrated sound-track and hundreds of stunning photo/slides by Dr. Charles Burnsworth of SUNY-Oneonta, when he presents his multi-media show entitled "The Age of Rock" which is to be presented locally at 7:00 p.m. on March 28, 1990 in the Brown Auditorium in Old Main on the SUNY-Cortland campus.

Burnsworth, a Professor of Music at the State University of New York at Oneonta is an entertainer with outstanding credentials and an authority on rock music. Altogether, he has performed nearly a hundred college dates with his "Age of Rock" and "Beatles" presentations. Both of these highly popular programs, as well as his acknowledged authority as a rock music historian has brought him national recognition. He has been selected as a SHOWCASE presenter six times within the past seven years: twice at National Conventions and a regional Convention for the National Association for Campus Activities, twice at State Conventions of the New York State School Music Association and for the 1989 State Convention of the School Administrators Association of New York State. His reputation as an outstanding and dynamic lecturer recently earned him an invitation to membership in the prestigious "International Platform Association."

The presentation, which is being sponsored jointly by the Sociology Club and the Cortland College Student Association at SUNY-Cortland, is a penetrating documentary which features the world's most charismatic rock stars set against the most significant events of the century's second half; the Kennedy murders, the hippie generation, the black power movement, the rock festivals and the Vietnam War. Including nearly seventy original recordings, numerous celebrity interviews and coordinated with over 500 visual portraits and graphics, the show is articulated with a dynamic narration which produces a totally memorable experience; one which has been characterized as "high powered entertainment." Admission to the event is free and is open to the public. An informal question/answer session will follow the presentation.
