- c. Demonstrate financial need (current year Financial Aid Form should be filed to document need.)

- d. A good moral character.

- e. All other qualifications by equal preference shall be given to persons who were student members, or who are direct lineal descendents of student members of Alpha Sigma Sorority.

No person shall be excluded by reason of age, race, creed, color, national origin, sex, disability, or marital status.
