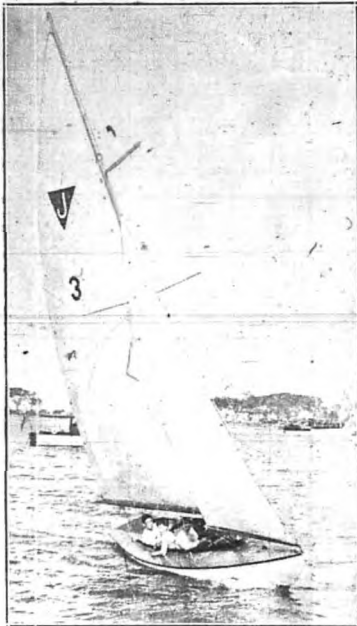
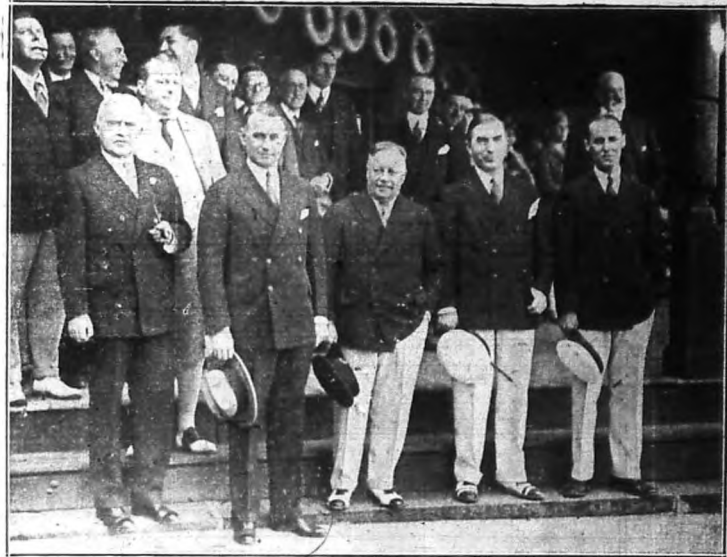

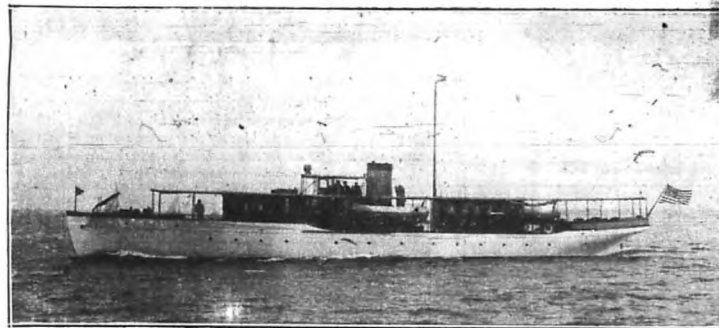
WYANDOTTE.

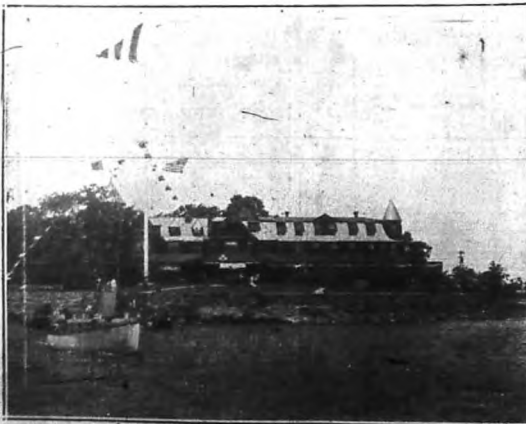
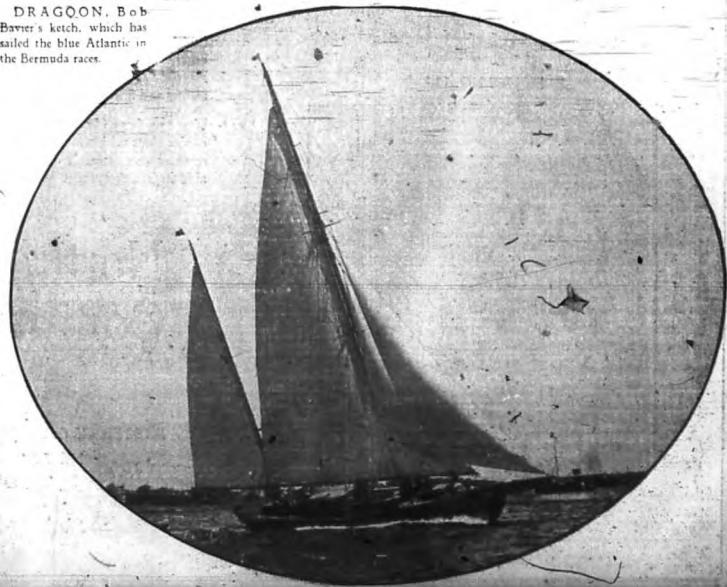


COMMODORE HENRY L. MAXWELL
