

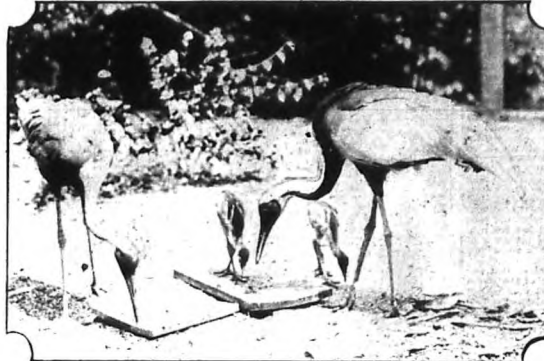

## Hatched in America



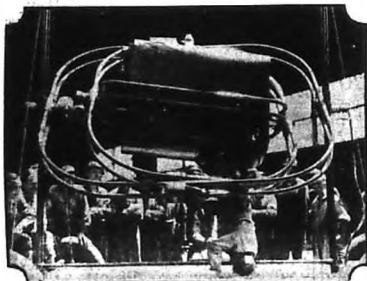

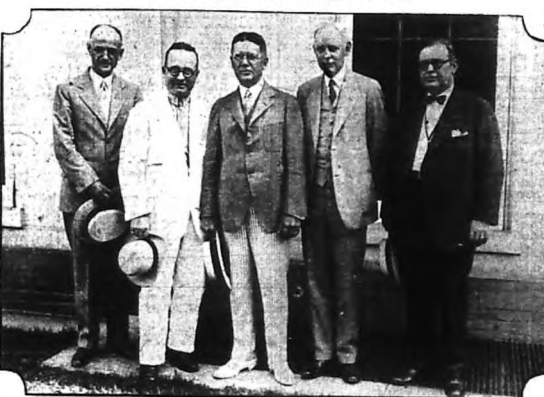

## Highest Paid Woman Artist



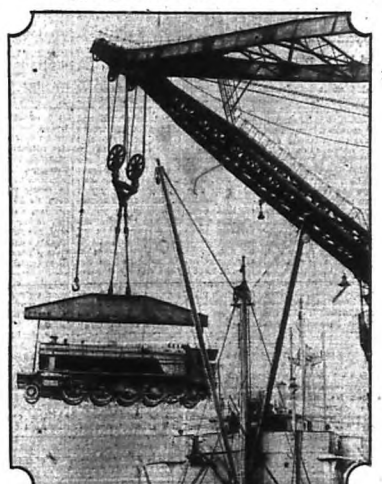
