The swimming closing date has also been fixed for the bath houses and beaches at Glen Island, Kingsland Point, Croton Point and Croquet.

Conditions are still favorable for swimming during the warm September days and the closing date is practically the same as that of last year when the swimming pools were closed on September 24.
