### REPLICA OF FIRST LAMP ON DISPLAY

Six Foot Tall Model of Incandescent Bulb to Be Exhibited by Westchester Lighting Company

A replica six feet in height, of the first practical incandescent lamp invented by Edison in the year 1879, is being exhibited in the booth of Westchester Lighting and its affiliated companies at the Exposition of Arts and Industries at the Hotel Astor, New York, which opened Monday, September 30th. The idea of the booth is the companies contribution to the celebra-

tion of lights golden jubilee this year. The replica stands on a black carpet against a wall set back into gold niches which catch the light of constantly moving lights in alternating colors of red and blue with amber and green, an expression of the modernistic lighting of today. The booth has a canopied ceiling in gold with a large black ring. A leaflet of black paper on which is a replica of the Edison lamp in gold paper, is being given to those viewing the booth before the closing of the exposition, Saturday, October 6. The Home Lighting Division of the company designed and lighted the booth which Martin J. Javoy of South Columbus avenue, carried out and built.
