What happens to the countless girls and women who arrive in White Plains perhaps after staying with neither friends to rely upon nor sufficient funds to stay at a hotel? They turn to the Young Women's Christian Association for help. The demand for inexpensive living quarters for these applicants has grown so insistently that the association has found it necessary to establish a new department which will be known as the Rooms Registry Department. Mrs. F. J. Arnold of 21 Lenox avenue has been chosen to head this department.

Since many of the room applicants are also looking for positions, the Y. W. C. A. associated with this plan are being considered for the establishment of an employment service.

Many are the questions asked the Y. W. C. A. concerning these girls and women who find themselves alone and friendless here. "Why do they come—with no employment and no place to live?" Invariably it is from a city of size like Philadelphia or New York that these women and girls have come. They seek a quieter place, a better climate and a town where employment is less keenly sought.
