AGRICULTURE PUBLIC SCHOOLS

State Commissioner Pearson Be-
lieves It Is Now Demanded
And Needed.

WOULD INCREASE PRODUCTION

\$50,000,000 to \$100,000,000 More
Might be Had From New York
Farms—Prices Would be
Lowered for City People.

Syracuse, N. Y., Dec. 29.—Agricul-
tural education along political lines
with a view to increasing farm pro-
duction will aid in the solution of the
question of the high cost of living,
according to State Commissioner of
Agriculture Raymond A. Pearson,
who delivered an address today on
"Education and Agriculture," before
the Associated Academic Principles
of the State of New York. He em-
phasized the importance of such ed-
ucation and detailed the growth of
farming in the east.

Commissioner Pearson strongly
recommends agricultural instruction
in the public schools. "I believe in
such instruction," said he, "because
it is now demanded and needed. It
is distinctly to the advantage of the
public to have it provided. If agri-
culture is to be conducted profitably,
instruction must be given because
methods must be used and these
generally practiced. Many

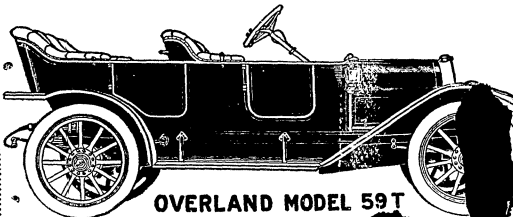
