THE ARROGANCE OF CAPITAL.

The tariff-fattened cotton-mill owners of Fall River "refuse to entertain any proposition or to make any concession whatever" looking to a settlement of the difficulty with their striking operatives.

This has been the attitude of the representatives of combined Capital towards organized Labor in nearly every difference that has arisen since the last election.

The mill operatives of Fall River receive absolutely less wages for the cloth produced than do the spinners and weavers in England, and they work more hours.

ARBOR DAY.

The first general observance of Arbor day in this State, under the act of 1883, to encourage arboriculture will be on Friday, May 3, 1889, and the duty is imposed upon the State Superintendent of Public Instruction to prescribe a course of exercises to be observed in the schools of the State in carrying out the spirit of the law.

Pending any further announcement the following observations and recommendations are submitted: The plain intent of the law is to encourage the planting, protection and preservation of trees and shrubs with such other features as will tend to impress upon the minds of all the desirability of beautifying school grounds, and of doing something to overcome the destruction of trees made necessary by the demands of business and commerce.

A bill has been introduced in the Assembly authorizing, but not compelling, the Boards of Supervisors in the several counties in the State to make their term of office two years.
