

MIDNIGHT DISPATCHES BY TELEGRAPH TO THE ADVANCE.

WAR NEWS.

Important Intelligence.

WASHINGTON, July 3.—It is said that a battle should take place in this vicinity, Gen. Scott has announced that he in person would direct the operations.

The following dispatch was received here at 2:15 this morning:

BLACK RIVER, near Martinsburgh, July 3. To Col. Edward Townsend, Asst. Adj. Gen.:

I left Williamsport at six o'clock this morning for this place, and routed the rebels, who were about 10,000 strong, and who had four guns. I now occupy their camp, with a loss of three killed and four wounded.

The Cabinet met to-day, in more than usual good spirits, in consequence of the good news.

A thirty-pounder rifled cannon just mounted here is at the Railroad station directed to Major Gen. McDowell, Newport. It is soon to be forwarded.

FORTRESS MONROE, July 3.—Col. Wardrop's pickets extend a mile and a half beyond Hampton.

Col. Webber's regiment is erecting a strong battery on this side of this of the bridge.

Yesterday a number of soldiers made a reconnaissance from Newport News up James River Road to within a mile of Great Bethel. At that point they came upon five rebel pickets who fled leaving their hats and coats showing they were officers.

Gen. Butler and family are at Newport News.

WASHINGTON, July 3. An expedition consisting of two companies from the first Michigan regiment and fourth and fifth Massachusetts regiments leave in the morning for the river road towards Mount Vernon. Impression exists that a battery is being erected near Mount Vernon with intention on the place.

The second Maine regiment is advancing.

Times dispatches: It is decided that there will be no paucity caucus had with reference to the organization of the house. Members will vote according to their directions.

James S. Wadsworth of Genesee, has accepted the position of aid to Gen. McDowell.

Col. Hunter of the third U. S. Cavalry will be relieved of his command by Col. Sherman, Brother to Senator Sherman, late principal director of the U. S. Military in Louisiana.

Col. Hunter will be made a Brigadier. Times' despatches state: A murder was committed at Georgetown early this morning. A private named John Holmes in Co. A., of the 8th N. Y. regiment was found dead near the corner of High-st., stabbed in two places. The evidence before the Coroner was to the effect that two men in the uniform of this regiment and the deceased had an altercation.

Several were promptly arrested, and one of them who returned into camp without his cap is suspected of the murder.

Late despatches received say that a large force are at Manassas Junction this evening.

The rebel advance guard is beyond Falls River and they have fortifications only on one point this side of Manassas Junction.

South Carolina regiments are reported to be within a few miles march of Alexandria.

The 9th regiment to-day moved forward to the Point of Rocks.

The N. Y. 1st regiment were ordered to-day to advance early to-morrow morning.

Col. Gard and family of this city is now at the Junction.

The 10th Pennsylvania regiment moved forward to-day to Point of Rocks.

The N. H. 1st received orders to-day to advance.

HAGERSTOWN, July 3.—The following is a list of wounded now in the hospital at the last fight with the rebels at Newport: 10th regiment Pennsylvania volunteers, James Morgan, Co. B, severely, and Frederick Hutchinson, Commissary Sergeant of camp Bryant, severely. Prof. Bonner of Co. G, not severely. (Geo. Drake of Co. A, and one whose name is not known by Capt. Mitchell. The names of others of the killed and wounded will be given in after a while and will be sent by telegraph as fast as it is possible to get them.

WASHINGTON 3.—The 20th regiment of N. Y. S. volunteers arrived here. The bridge burned at Newport by the rebels will be rebuilt within a week. Great preparations are being made to celebrate our national independence.

New-York, July 3.—Steamer Northern Light arrived from Aspinwall with mails and \$11,000 treasure from San Francisco, June 11th.

News from the Isthmus and South America unimportant.

The French exploring expedition up the Isthmus of Darien, returned unable to reach their object, and will try again next spring.

NEW CARTRIDGE.—The new metallic water-proof cartridge, which the Ordnance Department has ordered to be tested at West Point, is the invention of Willis E. Moore, of Crawfordsville, Indiana. The cartridge case is made of tin, in the shape of a cone, and has two weak points in its circumference. When it is in the cannon its apex touches the breech-piece, and thus a chamber is formed between the cartridge and the cannon, said chamber being in the rear of the cartridge. The cartridge is pricked by forcing a sharp instrument down through the vent. When the charge explodes, a portion of the gas escapes through the weak points of the cartridge into the air-chamber, and by its pressure instantly forces the metal case out of the gun. The value of this cartridge lies in the fact of its loading at the muzzle, and yet clearing the cannon at every shot in so perfect a manner that swabbing repeatedly is unnecessary.
