## Marion Receives \$350,460 Grant For Sewage Plant

Marion—A Pure Waters Grant of \$350,460 has been approved for the town of Marion for construction of a sewage treatment plant to help abate pollution of Lake Ontario. It was announced this week by Governor Rockefeller.

Senator Ted Day of the 49th Senatorial District and Assemblyman Joseph Finley, representing Wayne and Seneca Counties in the State Assembly, complimented the people of Marion for their progressive thinking and quick action to take advantage of the opportunity to take part in the state's Pure Water Program.

"That a little handful of 924 people should move ahead with plans for abatement of pollution," said Day, "I feel is very commendable."

"I admire the progressive thinking of the people of Marion for participating in the Pure Waters Program," said Finley.

The project will provide a complete new sewage system for Marion. The installation will include a collection system, a pumping station and a treatment plant providing tertiary treatment.

The receiving waters are tributary to Ganaruga Creek which drains through the State Barge and Oswego canals into Lake Ontario, the area legislators stated.

The Federal grant of this project is only \$5,940 or one per cent of the total eligible cost of \$594,000, the legislators stated.

Under the Pure Water Bond Act and Construction Aid Act of 1965 the state is providing a 30 per cent construction grant of \$178,200 and in addition is pre-financing 29 per cent or \$172,260, making the state grant 59 per cent of the eligible cost, explaining the area lawmakers to this newspaper from their Albany offices.

A federal grant application has been forwarded to the Federal Water Pollution Control Administration. Project engineers are Lozier Engineers, Inc., Rochester.
