

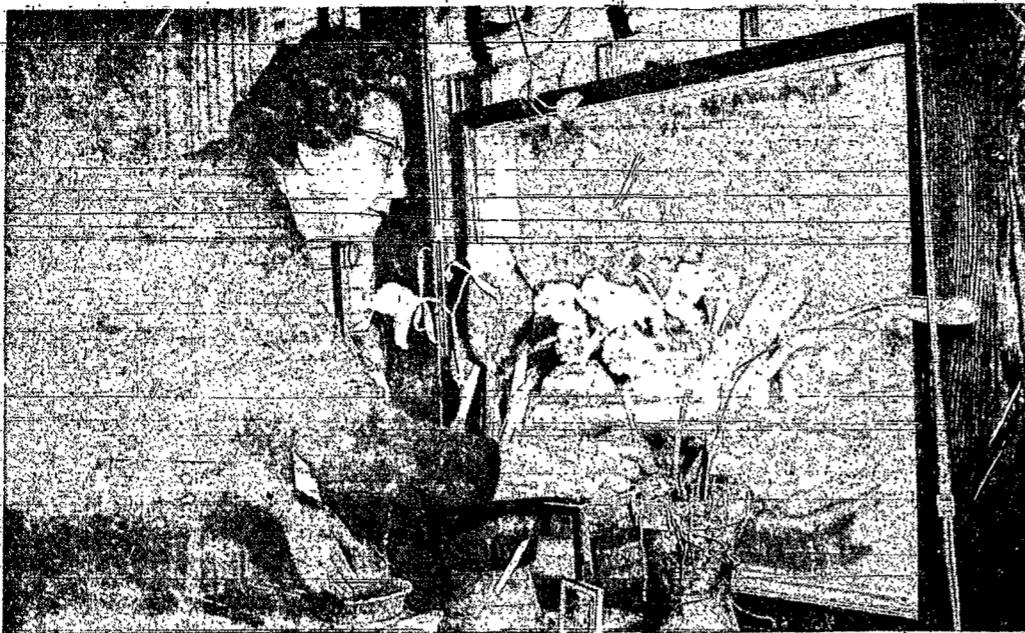
Army Specialist Receives Promotion In Vietnam

purple with dark purple tints and yellow white throat.

Mrs. Humeston tried to buy an orchid plant in a greenhouse in Rochester. She wanted one without a blossom. The price tag was \$20 a plant.

"I thought that was a little too much," she said. "So while I was in Florida last January I bought three of them for \$11."

The plants are doing very nicely in a room that faces the south.

She said the orchids require sunlight from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. with night temperatures ranging from 60 to 70 degrees. "I keep the temperature at 60 degrees in the daytime

"I think they're just gorgeous," she said. "They've always been my favorite flower."

There were no buds on the plants when Mrs. Humeston returned to Newark from her Florida visit. And the plants are not planted in dirt. They're planted in pine needles and stones.

"They require lots of water and a hot sun," said Mrs. Humeston. "I'll have her orchid corsage waiting for her Easter Sunday."
