Army Private Assigned As Clerk in Vietnam

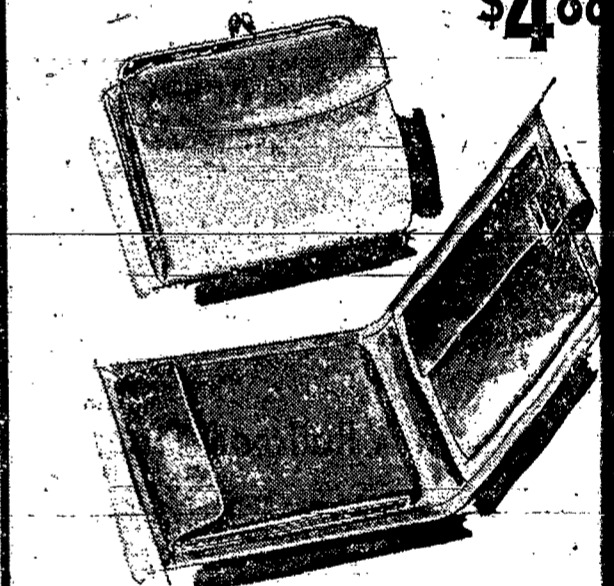
