

## Rocky Announces \$383,075 Grant For Area Project

Governor Rockefeller announced today approval of a \$383,075 Pure Waters program construction grant application by the Village of Macedon in Wayne County for a complete sanitary sewage system. Pure Waters program grants are provided under the direction of the State Health Department.

Initially the project will provide a complete sanitary sewage system for the Village of Macedon. Extensions of this are anticipated to serve populated areas of the Town of Macedon for a design population of 2,500 in 1985. Construction of the facility will abate pollution of the Barge Canal and Ganarua Creek.

The total estimated eligible cost of the project is \$549,280. The anticipated State grant of 59 per cent of the eligible cost includes \$194,784 or the full 30 per cent State share and an additional \$188,291 State prefinancing of the Federal share. Because of inadequate Congressional appropriations, for water pollution control the Federal grant will be only \$6,492 or one per cent of the total eligible cost.

An application for the Federal grant is being forwarded to the Federal Water Pollution Control Administration.

## Wayne Receives \$49,500 Grant For Recreation

Governor Rockefeller has announced approval of a \$49,500 federal grant-in-aid for outdoor recreation in Wayne County.

The federal grant was made under provisions of the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act. Federal grants are matched by local funds in each instance. The Governor said, "these grants are another example of Federal, State and local units of government working together to provide increased recreational population."

The \$49,500 grant to Wayne County is for acquisition of approximately 45 acres of land at Sands Point on Lake Ontario. Cost of the project includes the installation of underground electric lines presently overhead; development of a picnic area, beach and bathhouse facilities.

The Sands Point property is the last existing available parcel of land in this area for park development along the shores of Lake Ontario and provides a much needed facility for the people of Wayne County and adjacent areas, according to the governor's office.

## Former Wayne Resident Named To \$15,000 Post

Russell M. Fowler of Baldwinsville, a former Wayne County resident, has been named as administrator for the Wayne Economic Development Corporation at a salary of \$15,000 a year.

He was selected among 50 applicants by a six-member panel from the Wayne Economic Development Committee. Fowler, 52, was born on a farm in the South Butler-Savannah area. For the past six years he has operated his own business in Baldwinsville, primarily selling electronic systems to upstate schools. His firm deals with 85 schools with a volume of about \$500,000.

Fowler, a graduate of Syracuse University and Fordham Law School, will begin working immediately to help draw up and implement an overall economic development plan for Wayne County and try to recruit new industry in the county.

The Wayne Economic Development has a \$43,385 budget for the year beginning last July 1 of which \$28,460 comes from a federal grant. An assistant to the administrator and a secretary also will be hired.

## Macedon Told To Stop Open Refuse Burning

The Town of Macedon has been ordered by the State Health Department to stop the open burning of refuse. Dr. Hollis S. Ingraham, state health commissioner has announced.

Dr. Ingraham said the order is based on a signed stipulation in which town officials agreed that sufficient facts exist to warrant such an order. The stipulation, which ended the need for a public hearing in the case, was signed by Augustine Marvin, town supervisor, and Maurice Strubridge of Newark, town attorney.

Department officials said the town had burned industrial wastes from a plastics manufacturer.

Open burning is prohibited under both the State Sanitary Code and the State Air Pollution Control Board Rules. Violation of an order can be punished by fines of up to \$1,000 for the violation plus up to \$200 per day for each day it continues.

The only currently acceptable method for disposing of all types of normal solid waste including bulky items, refuse and garbage is the sanitary landfill. In a sanitary landfill, refuse must be compacted daily and covered with at least six inches of earth or other suitable material. Within a week after final deposits are made in the area, they must be compacted and covered with two feet of material.

In addition, flies, rodents, vermin and other insects must be kept under control, papers and other refuse must be confined to the disposal area by fencing or other suitable means; salvaging of refuse must be regulated to avoid creating a nuisance, and the approach road must be kept open to vehicular traffic throughout the year.

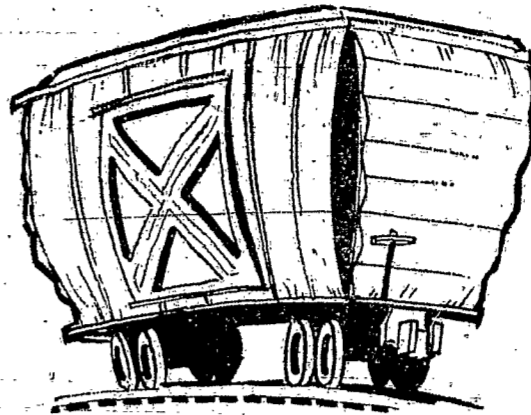

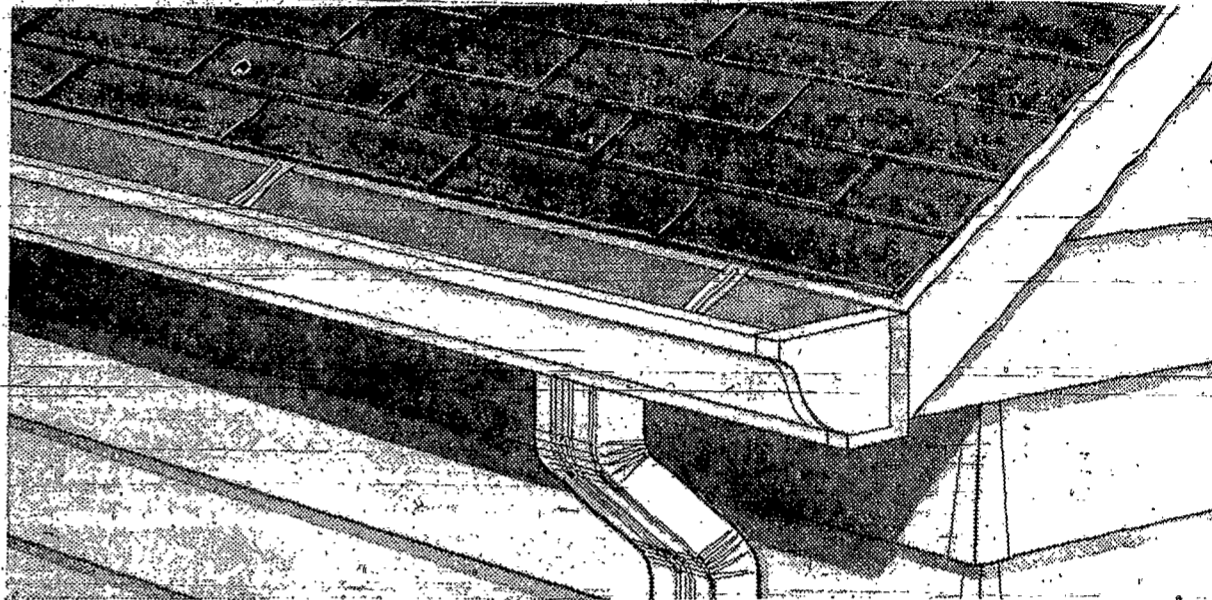
