Arcade opened up the scoring early in the first period on an Attica fourth down. The ball was on the Attica 15 with fourth down and Attica ready to kick. The hike from center went over the kickers head into the end zone where Joe Hoffman pounced on it for a safety or two points. Attica refused to call it quits and stormed back late in the second period to go ahead for the first and last time in the game. A sustained drive carried them to the Arcade 12 where they scored on a pass. They made their extra point also via a pass. Arcade finally got their offense rolling midway through the second period with Bernie Hoffman and Ed Walters doing the most damage. Hoffman's runs and Walters' passes had carried Arcade to the Attica 15. Bernie Hoffman took a handoff, cut over right guard, slanted off to his left and scored untouched behind some great blocking. The extra point was missed and Arcade led at half time, 8-7. The third period was half over when Arcade again carried the ball into Attica territory. Jack Fries and Bruce Hoffman slashed through the Attica defenses while Walters passes again moved Arcade into scoring position. Again it was Bernie Hoffman taking a handoff and sprinting around his left end to score. An exceptional Attica punt, a pass, was missed so Arcade clung to their 14-7 lead. From then on it was strictly the defense that shone. The front line of Myerhoff, Joe Hoffman, Ferrington, Fox, Garlappo, Ashworth and Bolden made life miserable for the Attica backs. Ed Walters, Doug Moore and Bob Brettwise guarded the secondary line as was Fort (Continued on Page 5)
