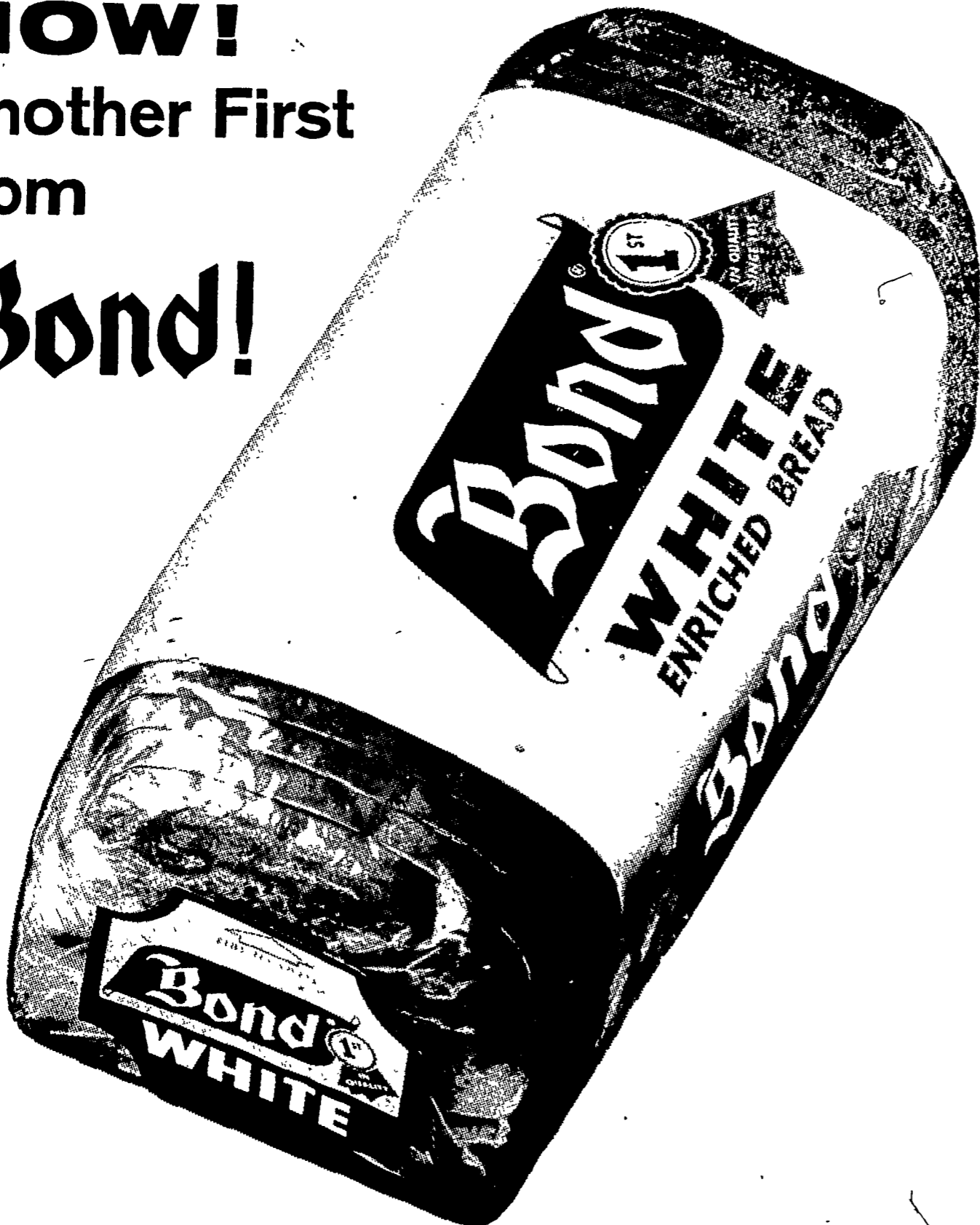

**Bright Fall Colors At Letchworth Park**

The usual brilliant display of varied fall leaf hues is beginning early at Western New York's famous Letchworth State Park and is attracting large numbers of visitors. As different varieties of trees reach their peak color display at varying times, visitors to the park at any time during the month of October will be rewarded by flaming colors on the canyon walls.

Glen Iris Inn, within the park, will be open for lodgings and meals through November 1, and park camping cabins will be open through October 26 for the convenience of park patrons. The restaurant at the Lower Falls will be open weekends through October.

Each year, the maximum daily attendance in the park occurs in October. Last year, 84,000 visitors came to the park in that month. This is the ideal time for hiking along the winding gorge and on the quiet wood trails.

**Fish and Game WORLD**

We have been asked by some readers to list the game laws so they may clip this information and carry it afield for convenient, repeated reference. Last week we gave the open seasons and bag limits for squirrels, ruffed grouse, and woodcock—game that may now be shot—and now others will be considered.

Ducks, and Coots—In Upstate New York the season extends from Oct. 16 through Dec. 4, with a daily limit of 3 ducks and 3 coots, 6 of each in possession, Long Island, and that part of Westchester Co. south of Hutchinson Parkway, Nov. 14 through Dec. 23, with limits of 4 ducks and 4 coots daily, 8 of each in possession.

NOTE: The daily bag may not include more than one canvas-back OR one redhead OR one ruddy duck AND one hooded merganser AND two wood ducks. In addition, the daily bag of American and red breasted mergansers ("sawbills" or "fish ducks") is 5 with 10 in possession, singly or in the aggregate of both kinds.

Gunning hours opening day, 12 noon Eastern Standard Time to sunset; remaining days, sunrise to sunset.

Geese and Brant—Upstate, Oct. 16-Dec. 14, Long Island and Westchester Co. south of Hutchinson Parkway, Oct. 24-Dec. 22. Limits (entire state) 2 geese daily, 4 in possession, brant, 6 daily and 6 in possession. Same gunning hours. Snow geese are protected.

Wilson's Snipe—Upstate, Oct. 16-Nov. 14, Long Island and Westchester south of Hutchinson Parkway, Nov. 14-Dec. 13. Limits are 8 daily, 8 in possession. Shooting hours same as above.

To shoot migratory waterfowl, gunners must have a Migratory Hunting Stamp, costing \$3.00, obtained at post offices.

Sportsmen should note that gunning hours open at noon first day of the season, rather than one-half hour before sunrise as previously, and thereafter sunrise to sunset.

Cock Pheasants—Oct. 26-Nov. 14, with Sunday hunting prohibited EXCEPT in Delaware, Greene, Orange, Rockland, Sullivan and Ulster Counties Limit, 2 per day, 8 for the season.

Hen Pheasants—Oct. 26-Nov. 14, only in Clinton, Essex, Franklin, Herkimer, Lewis, Montgomery, St. Lawrence, Schenectady, Schoharie, Delaware, Sullivan, Orange, Rockland, Putnam, and Westchester Counties No Sunday hunting EXCEPT in Delaware, Orange, Rockland, and Sullivan Counties Limit, 2 per day, 8 for the season.

NOTE: In counties where both the bag limit is 2 pheasants per sexes of pheasants may be shot, the bag limit is 2 pheasants per day, 8 for the season, in the aggregate—regardless of sex.

Cottontail Rabbits—Oct. 26-Feb. 29, with 6 per day and no season limit EXCEPT 4 per day in Clinton, Essex, Franklin, Fulton, Hamilton, Herkimer, Jefferson, Lewis, Montgomery, Oneida, Oswego, St. Lawrence, Saratoga, Warren, Washington, Allegany, Cattaraugus, Chautauqua, Steuben, and Yates Counties.

Raccoon (by hunting)—Oct. 26-Feb. 29, with no bag limit. Hungarian Partridge—Oct. 26-Nov. 14, only in the four counties of Clinton, Franklin, Jefferson, and St. Lawrence. No Sunday hunting.

Quail—Nov. 1-15, only in Putnam and Westchester Counties. Four per day, 10 for the season.

Varying Hare (Snowshoe Rabbit)—Three different seasons, as follows:

Dec. 2-Feb. 29, in counties of Clinton, Essex, Franklin, Fulton, Hamilton, Herkimer, Jefferson, Lewis, Oneida, Oswego, St. Lawrence, Saratoga, Warren, Washington, Delaware, Greene, Otsego (south of the D & H railroad), Rensselaer, Schoharie, Sullivan, and Ulster Three per day, with no season limit.

Dec. 2-Jan. 31, in Cattaraugus County only, with one per day the bag limit.

Jan. 30-Feb. 29, east of Route 11, in both Cortland and Onondaga Counties, in Chenango west of Route 12, and Madison. Bag limit of one per day.
