Arcade Drops First Game of Season, 34-14; Bad First Half Costs Orange and Black Ball Game

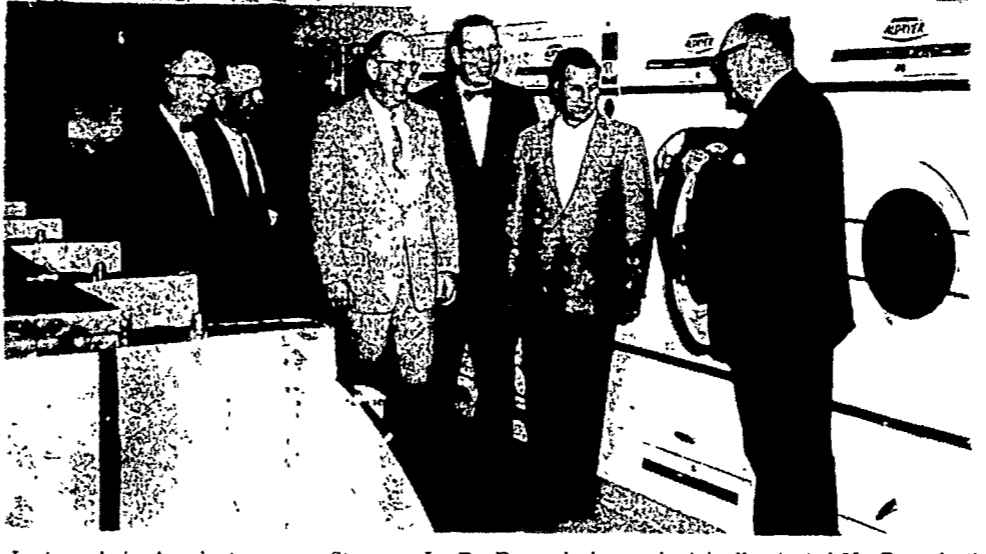

The second period proved just as frustrating to Arcade, as Warsaw continued to move all over the field. The Tigers scored on a 20 yard pass and converted the extra point to give them a 28-0 lead. Arcade fought back with a sustained drive capped by an 18 yard scoring pass from Ed Walter to end John Meyerhoff who shed one tackler before going into the end zone untouched. Bernie Hoffman went over on an end sweep for the extra point. The half ended with Warsaw leading, 28-7.

Many Items On Agenda Of Holland Town Board Meeting

At the last meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Holland held October 7, Xavier Stamer was present and discussed the road to his property across the railroad tracks. A motion was made and carried by the Town Board to extend Edgwood Road to the Stemper property line when the owner conveys a 50 foot right of way to the town and constructs a road acceptable to the Highway Superintendent.

The Town Board went on record as favoring taking to court the case of \$7,000 owed by the town according to equalization rating.

It was decided that a request be made to the State for caution signs to be placed at Main and Pearl Streets and near the Methodist Church.

A motion was made to appoint four women as school crossing guards to escort children to school, from religious instruction classes, the cost to be \$1.35 per hour, two of the guards to have a steady position and the other two to be alternates.

Hillcrest Road was accepted by the Town Board. Other business of the evening included a decision to appoint extra constables for Halloween and the approval of the preliminary budget by the Board members, the hearing to be held on November 4.

Home Demonstration Unit of Sandusky To Make Hats

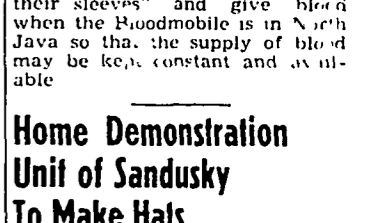
Members of the Sandusky Home Demonstration Unit #1 have their lesson on hat making Thursday, October 22 at 10:00 a. m. at the Town Hall.
