On September 28 at 8 p. m. the program for the Eighth Annual Negro Anniversary will be held at the Statler Hilton Hotel, Embassy Room. A parade will follow Saturday Sept. 29 at 10 a. m. on Main St. from North St. to No. 131 & T Plaza.

The observance is being sponsored by the Negro American Bazaar, Mrs. J. Monroe, founder, Rev. Emory Day, president and M. Sgt. Donald R. Scott is parade marshal.

In the opening night a keynote address by Rev. Monroe, special music and the crowning of the Queen will highlight the program.

It is indeed heartening to observe that there still remains some of our people who are proud of their specific identity as a race.
