cups sugar. Two eggs, well beaten. One cup buttermilk. One teaspoon soda. Two teaspoons baking powder. One half teaspoon vanilla. One half teaspoon salt and three and one half cups flour. One cup raisins or nuts. In a large bowl: mix the well beaten eggs, melted shortening, buttermilk and vanilla. Blend in sifted dry ingredients and the raisins or nuts. Put in cool place (refrigerator) for one hour. Drop by large spoonfuls on a cookie sheet (the kind with sides). Bake at 375 degrees about fifteen minutes. The time varies according to your own oven temperature. Test for doneness after twelve minutes baking.  
During the baking period the dough will spread. After removing from the oven, sprinkle lightly with granulated sugar. Cut into squares and place on a rack to cool. Delicious!  
Time to go now but will be back again next week.

**Deputies Nab 3 Burglars**

Three juveniles were arrested March 10 by Sheriff's Deputies Floyd Martin and John K. Harris after three burglaries were reported in the towns of Greig and Martinsburg.  
Dputy Martin said two 14-year-olds and a 15-year-old arrested were referred to family court and their names were not released.  
The Glenfield grade school in the South Lewis Central School District was entered after 7 p.m., March 9, and was reported at 9 a.m., March 10. Entry was made by breaking a window in the basement door. Once inside the youths ransacked the building taking a small amount of money and entered the school cafeteria where they apparently lunched on milk and potato sticks.  
In one classroom, it was reported they wrote obscene language on the blackboard and butted a cigarette on the top of a desk. The exact cost of the damage and amount of money taken was not determined.  
The youths also allegedly entered the Glen Tucker trailer, Glenfield Road, Town of Greig, by breaking the front. Mr. and Mrs. Tucker are in Florida and a caretaker reported the burglary at 11:30 a.m., March 10. The vandals did some damage to the interior of the trailer home, taking some articles. The loss will not be known until the owner arrives home.  
The home of Rev. John Joslin, Glenfield, R.D., Town of Greig, was also reported by a caretaker as broken into. Entry was gained by forcing a rear window. Once inside, the youths ransacked the home, taking money and other items including coins from a valuable collection. Some were recovered and the exact loss was not determined as Rev. Joslin is away.  
Deputies said the arrested youths were local residents. The case is still under investigation.


