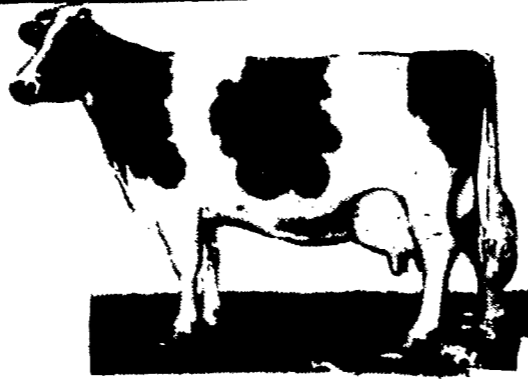

Conservation Corner

Regular contributors to this column are the four conservation-oriented agencies in Lowville: A.S.C.S., Department of Environmental Conservation, Extension Service and Soil Conservation Service. This week's column comes from the A.S.C.S.

The recent flood damage was not nearly as serious in Lewis County as it was in the counties to the lower central part of the State. In these sections, lives were lost, buildings damaged and destroyed, and many people there need helping hands and financial assistance. Some people from Lewis County have volunteered their assistance and the local Kiwanis Club held an auction last Friday to raise money for flood victims.

However in Lewis County, the county was designated as a disaster county because of the loss to crops, cropland and damage to fences in the flood areas. The estimated loss was set at \$231,000 by the local disaster committee. Being designated a disaster county, the ASCS office is offering Emergency Conservation Measures (ECM) to farmers and rural landowners having damage to cropland and fields in the flood areas along the Black River or land damaged by one of the many tributaries of the Black River.

Already 20 persons have made 33 requests for cost-sharing as-

istance for ECM practices in the county.

The five following ECM practices are being offered in the county at 80% of the cost being shared by the federal government:

1. Restoring open drainage ditches damaged by the flood. Cost will be shared only for earth moved in restoration of the ditch.
2. Rehabilitating crop, hay and pasture lands damaged by flood water. Cost will be shared for debris removal which cannot be incorporated in the soil through normal farming operations.
3. Rehabilitating stream channels damaged by flood water. Cost will be shared only for the removal of sediment and debris from the stream channel and the repair of stream banks damaged by the flood waters.
4. Reconstructing fences damaged by the flood water. Cost will be shared only for the restoration of fences needed to prevent damage by livestock and areas that should remain in permanent cover.
5. Restoring critical areas damaged by the flood water. Cost will be shared to restore permanent cover on critical areas such as diversion ditches, dams, dikes, gullies, stream banks, and similar problem areas.

Anyone wishing more information about the emergency conservation measures or who would like to enroll please stop at the Lewis County ASCS Office, Reed Block, State Street, Lowville. Work may be started on any of the practices, but persons must have a request filed within 30 days.
