ucation reserving the right to review any action taken in subsidizing the acreage. The purpose of this action is to allow a non-profit agricultural organization to involve itself in managing a large segment of land and, in the process, maintain the quality of the land through possible fertilization, drainage, tilling and seeding by the Chapter or by the party who sub-leases the land for agricultural purposes.
