The funeral for Edward Kloster, 93, of Indian River, who died July 8 in Lewis County General Hospital, will be July 9 at the family home and in St. Anthony's Church, Indian River. Rev. Carey Kean, pastor, officiating. Burial was in St. Vincent de Paul Cemetery, Belfort.

Mr. Kloster is survived by three daughters, Ruth Kloster, Mrs. Erma Bolter, Mrs. Gerald (Doris) Chartrand, all of Indian River; three sons, Albert, Croghan, Anselm, and Leo, both of Indian River; 14 grandchildren, 39 great-grandchildren; nieces and nephews.

He was born at Indian River Feb. 29, 1880, son of John and Mary Back Kloster and had lived in that section all his life. He was employed years ago as a carpenter for Lehman and Zehr and then worked for the Croghan Town Highway Department. He also was a farmer and self-employed carpenter.

He married Margaret Snyder, Oct. 24, 1905 in St. Anthony's Church. Mrs. Kloster died Sept. 7, 1961.

Mr. Kloster was a member of St. Anthony's Church and a former member of Indian River Grange.
